2005 Virginia Preservation Awards

Each year since 1971, APVA Preservation Virginia has presented preservation awards to deserving individuals, private preservation or civic groups, or governmental agencies within the Commonwealth that have made an important contribution to preservation efforts. The deadline for nominations this year is NOVEMBER 29, 2004. Up to six awards will be presented during APVA's Legislative Reception in February.

Categories for awards are:

The Fredrick Doventon Nichols Award

presented for the best domestic architectural restoration project in Virginia. Former students of Mr. Nichols at the University of Virginia established this award in 1995.

Gabriel Page's Historic Preservation Awards

presented each year for outstanding preservation efforts on the part of businesses or civic organizations, individuals, or governmental agencies. The awards honor the memory of Gabriela Page, who served as President of APVA Preservation Virginia from 1944 to 1947, and includes an honorary certificate of recognition. The names of the recipients are added to a plaque in the State APVA Preservation Virginia office in Richmond. Up to four awards will be given.

The Mary Mason Anderson Williams Award

presented for an outstanding preservation effort on the part of a public or private preservation or civic group or individual. The Award was endowed by the late Mrs. Henry Winston Holt in honor of her mother and includes an honorary certificate and a cash grant of \$1,000.
